New Benefit Ticket Purchase Timeline— Please purchase your 2025 benefit ticket by February 28, 2025.

At our December 10, 2024, general meeting, it was announced that starting with the 2025-2026 season, annual dues and the required benefit ticket for active members will be combined into a single payment, due in June of each year

his means that over the next few months, you will be asked to make two payments:

 By February 28, 2025: Purchase your required ticket (\$125) for the 2025 benefit. You can buy additional tickets and make donations at this time or at a later date.

 By June 15, 2025: Make one payment of \$175 for your 2025-26 membership dues (\$50) and your 2026 benefit ticket (\$125). Note: A link for this payment will be provided closer to the date.

You can also pay by check. Please note on your check that it is for 2025-2026 dues and the 2026 benefit.

While we realize that during this transition year purchasing two benefit tickets within a few months may present a challenge, going forward this change will provide us with several advantages.

- Members can make one payment (dues + benefit ticket) each year.
- Members can make any additional donations they would like to make.
- Bookkeeping, budgeting, and the benefit RSVP process will be much easier for those who are handling those activities.

or our 2025 donation, we were moved by our President, Angie Wilcox, and her brave battle with breast cancer. We wanted to direct our AWCA donation to support other women in Arlington who are facing breast cancer but who lack the financial stability to provide for their whole care.

Our donation will specifically support Breast Cancer patients in the Arlington Free Clinic's Women's Health Program. This donation is timely, as their previous breast cancer programmatic grants will sunset in February of 2025.

Our funds will:

- Provide essential care, breast and cervical cancer screenings, breast cancer survivorship services, and education to approximately 1,000 women who would otherwise lack access to these important services. In 2023, 656 patients were referred by AFC for a screening mammogram. By offering women the opportunity to receive early diagnosis and treatment for cancer, these services can mean the difference between life and death.
- Fund up to four women's health clinics each month during which a team of volunteer physicians, nurse practitioners, and other professionals provide Pap tests and clinical breast exams as well as individual and small group education. AFC educates women and encourages healthy behaviors that will improve overall health.
- Support AFC in serving 20 active breast cancer patients who are either undergoing treatment or in remission and on hormone therapy. AFC is also supporting one BRCA1+ patient with ongoing tracking.

 Help AFC provide comprehensive survivorship services that include screening for recurrence of cancer, managing lasting physical and emotional side-effects, and improving health behaviors to enhance overall health and quality of life. AFC ensures patients are taking proper medications, reminds them of appointments, provides transportation to more advanced treatments and surgeries, and offers navigation care and appointment scheduling for oncology, radiology, GYN, and other appointments

We want to mention that while AWCA has supported the Arlington Free Clinic in the recent past, our funds were directed to other AFC programs: the Hearing and Vision Program (2022-2023) and the Dental Program (2021-2022).

On October 14, 2024, Maureen and Phil Caughran attended the launch of NASA's Europa Clipper spacecraft from Cape Canaveral, Florida. Their son Dan Caughran leads the team that built the radio on the spacecraft. Dan is an electrical engineer at the Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Lab in Laurel, Maryland and a graduate of Yorktown High School and Virginia Tech. The Europa Clipper is on its way to Jupiter, where, when it arrives in April 2030, it will orbit Jupiter and gather information on the subsurface oceans on Jupiter's moon Europa. Over the next four years until the end of the mission, the radio will send the data collected back to earth for scientists to analyze.
